TRAINING AND TESTING

1. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) and its instructors are authorised by the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA), to deliver Compulsory Basic Training (CBT) and pre-test training.
2. Training and testing at Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) is subject to the terms and conditions herein and in any publicity material or correspondence as issued by Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training).
3. You must produce a valid UK driving licence with provisional entitlement for motorcycles (both parts if a photo card licence) and a suitable form of identification (current passport) if you have an old style licence. All EU licence holders must also produce a U.K. counterpart with their EU licence.
4. If you have completed your Compulsory Basic Training (CBT) elsewhere, you must produce your certificate before you undergo any further training with Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training). You must also be prepared to undergo, if necessary, an assessment ride.
5. If you are using your own machine, you must produce a valid certificate of insurance that covers your use of that vehicle on a road, vehicle excise licence and current MOT certificate, if required. Machine must also display L Plates at the correct size front and rear and be in a roadworthy condition.
6. The term "working day", as used in any section below, does not include weekends, public or bank holidays.
7. The student is responsible for any fines and endorsements as a result of any road traffic offence committed by them.

FAILURE TO PRODUCE DOCUMENTS

1. If you fail to produce the required documentation to the DVSA examiner on your practical test, you will have the test terminated by the DVSA and the test fee will be lost. The DVSA will not refund a test fee for any reason whatsoever once a test has been named, even serious medical conditions.

INJURIES AND ACCIDENTS/LIABILITIES

1. At Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training), we will do everything within our power to ensure the safety of our trainees but, obviously, riding a motorcycle or scooter (includes moped) carries some risk to the rider. The student must understand these risks and agree to undergo training at their own free will. **It is recommended you have personal accident insurance for the duration of the course.**
2. Although every effort is made to ensure your safety during your course / lesson, you must realistically accept that there is a possibility that an accident may occur that causes loss, damage, expense, or personal injury to you. Unless shown to be negligent, your instructor and / or Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) is not liable to you for any expenses, loss, damage or personal injury as a result of any accident that may occur.
3. The student accepts responsibility for their own actions during the training and any possible injury caused to them during their training.

4. Any student that sustains injury during their training will have their training stopped and medical attention will be sought if needed. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) recommends that medical attention is sought in all cases and that injuries are checked by a medical practitioner. However, if the student is happy to continue the training it will be at their own discretion. Any medical issues, special needs or medication needs to be reported to your instructor before booking or training can commence.

5. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to terminate training in the event of any student riding in a dangerous or negligent manner. This includes on public highways and private property. Any student misusing Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles or equipment will have his/her training terminated. No refund will be issued.

BOOKINGS

If you book any bike training with Moto-pass Motorcycle Training you must be a competent CBT rider, you must be able to do a basic U-Turn, Figure of 8s, Hill Start, Change Gears satisfactorily and have Basic Machine Control Skills. Should you not be at the basic level of competency your course will be cancelled and postponed to a later date. No refunds will be made. During the Motorcycle Course, the decision to upgrade you to the big bike rests solely with your instructor. On rare occasions, pupils may not reach the level of skill required to upgrade to the big bike within the timescales of a normal course or to complete the CBT (Day 1 of your motorcycle course). In such a situation, your instructor will explain the alternatives to you. Certain options may mean additional training or extra DVSA test costs to you and are subject to instructor availability, which is not guaranteed. No refund will be made if you are not able to complete your motorcycle courses.

For Direct Access courses, Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will not upgrade you to a big bike unless we are completely satisfied that you are able to handle the machine safely. If for whatever reason, you do not handle a big machine safely, then we reserve the right to downgrade you to a 125cc machine. No refund will be made. For other courses, Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will not upgrade you to a big bike unless we are completely satisfied that you are able to handle the machine safely, irrespective of the course chosen i.e. A2 or DAS.

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to cancel any tuition should there be a suspicion that the Pupil is under the influence of drink or drugs or if the Pupil is not legal to ride on the road (eg you fail an eye test). Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) also reserves the right to stop tuition at any time when the Pupil is not safe on the road and is not acting in accordance with instructions. No refund of fees will be made in such a situation. Should you at anytime during your course cancel or stop your training, which would be your decision, not the instructors, no refund, costs or test fees will be payable. Any course fees paid are only valid for 12 months, outside this scope you would then have to repay in full to retake your course.

1. No refund will be made for A1/A2/DAS, Progressive/Accelerated Access, Back to Biking or CBT courses booked. If you postpone your course within 14 working days of your course start date you will be liable for 10% administration charge. Should you cancel any of the above courses 14 days (working week days) prior to your course start date you will be liable for the full amount of the course as detailed in your email.

2. Payment can be made to Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) by either Debit/Credit (no American Express cards) card or cash.

3. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to cancel, amend or re-arrange the date and time of training, giving reasonable notice where possible.

COURSES (PACKAGES)

1. A deposit of £250 (all deposits are non-refundable) is required on booking a Direct Access (DAS) course or an A1/A2 course. Students opting for a Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) DAS or A1/A2 course understand that a course price is the normal daily rate for training.

2. The whole course must be booked in its entirety to obtain the package course rate - otherwise the normal daily rate applies.

DVSA PRACTICAL MOTORCYCLE TESTS

1. Both A1/A2 and Direct Access licenses are gained through a two-part practical test (Module One and Module Two.) It is a requirement of the DVSA that Module One is passed before Module Two is attempted.

2. If Module One is failed, three clear working days are required before a further Module One attempt, this is dependent on test and instructor availability.

3. If Module Two is failed, ten clear working days are required before a further Module Two attempt, this is dependent on test and instructor availability

4. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) recommends that the Mod 1 test and the Mod 2 test is separated by 5 working days, If however the student requires for personal reasons that the Module 1 and Module 2 be booked either on the same day or within 5 days of each the student understands that if the Module 1 test is failed, the fee for the Module 2 test will be lost to the DVSA and any other subsequent tests will be charged at the standard DVSA test rate.

5. If the student requires further training, for a re-test of either Module One or Module Two, usual training fees apply.

6. If a test is cancelled by the DVSA because of adverse weather or government restrictions, having been taken to the Test Centre, half the session fee will be charged.

7. If a test is cancelled by the DVSA because of Industrial Action or an inability on the part of the DVSA to conduct the test, the student will be charged the full session fee which will be claimed back from the DVSA.

8. Motorcycle tests are not a guaranteed; however, Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will endeavour to support pupils in gaining a pass.

CANCELLATIONS

All motorcycle course deposits are non-refundable. Practical tests booked via Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) must be cancelled with no less than 14 clear working days' notice (i.e. Monday to Friday). Students cancelling practical tests within 14 clear working days (Monday to Friday) will be liable for the full test fee. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will endeavour to reallocate the test or move the test on to a future date; however, if this cannot be achieved then the full test fee will be forfeit. If a further test is required by the student an additional test fee is applicable. Test fees are set by the DVSA.

Any course training days cancelled before their scheduled start time will need to be paid for in full.

Moto-pass Motorcycle Training Ltd may cancel training courses in adverse weather conditions that make the training unsafe to proceed. Prior notification will be given to the client as soon as possible before the start of the course. If your training has already commenced and needs to be cancelled 50% of the cost of the days training will be payable or retained. No refunds will be offered.

DAMAGE TO VEHICLES OR KIT

1. Vehicles are motorcycles, mopeds and scooters.

2. Kit includes: Helmet, Gloves, Body Armour, Waterproofs, training tabards and radio equipment.

3. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) School students are covered by the Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) 3rd Party Insurance only.

4. Personal accident insurance is NOT included. You may wish to consult your own insurance broker for this.

5. Like all Insurance policies, Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) has an excess to pay in the event of a 3rd Party claim. Currently £350.

6. Accident damage to Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles will be charged. The cost of the damage will be assessed by the relevant motorcycle dealership or minor damage by our in-house mechanic and the cost of said damage plus any labour costs will be expected within 7 working days of notification. The current maximum charge for damage to our vehicles is £1,500, or the cost of the relevant part, e.g., brake lever £35.

7. Any repair and/or damage rectification to Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles will be completed by the in house qualified motorcycle mechanic or any other relevant motorcycle dealership as determined by Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training).

8. The motorcycle repairs will be carried out by said dealer or for very minor damage the Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) Mechanic. No labour charges will be incurred if the damage is minor and can be dealt with in house.

9. If damage is caused to a helmet then the full cost of the helmet will be required by the student on the day the damage took place. The current maximum charge for a helmet is £50.
10. If damage is caused to any other piece of kit by the student during training the cost of repair or replacement will be assessed and the student will be required to pay within 7 days of the damage taking place.
11. The full cost of replacements will be required for the loss of keys, or key programming by the student.
12. Quotes for damage to Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles / kit must be paid for by the customer/student within 7 days of receiving the quote. Parts ordered for damaged vehicles must be ordered by Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) from authorised and known suppliers only. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will not accept parts ordered by the customer/student from unknown sources.
13. The student will be liable for the full cost of damage to the motorcycle they have been on, to a maximum of £1,500. The cost of the damage will be assessed by our in-house mechanic or the relevant motorcycle dealership and the cost of the damage, including any labour costs will be expected within 7 working days of notification. If the total cost is in excess of £1,500, the student will be liable for the first £1,500 of repair. By signing the course agreement at the start of the course, you agree to the above statement.
14. Any delay of payment will result in immediate legal action. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to claim for loss of earnings if the vehicle is rendered off road, damages and/or any related legal costs.

THIRD PARTY DAMAGE

If an accident occurs involving a 3rd Party claim, the Insurance excess (currently £350) will be required to be paid within 7 days. Any delay of payment will result in legal action. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to claim for loss of earnings if the vehicle is rendered off road, damages and/or any related legal costs.

VEHICLES

1. Any student using his/her own motorcycle for training must ensure that the vehicle complies with all legal requirements in existence at the time of training and/or testing.
2. Vehicle road tax must be valid, L plates must be displayed front and rear, and vehicle tyres must be within the legal limits.
3. The maintenance and reliability of the student's vehicle shall be the student's sole responsibility.
4. Students turning up for training on un-roadworthy vehicles have the option to use one of the Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles (if available) the additional bike hire will be charged at that time, if a vehicle is not available and the lesson has to be cancelled the pupil will need to rebook and pay in again in full.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS

Full disclosure must be made by the student, at the time of booking, if he/she knows of any drug/medical/medication condition (prescription or otherwise) that could impair his/her riding ability. Failure to disclose any issues that become apparent to Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) Instructors will result in the termination of the training. No refund will be issued.

MOTO-PASS (MOTORCYCLE TRAINING) VEHICLES

1. Students using Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles are responsible for the vehicle they are using on the day.
2. The vehicle keys are the responsibility of the student using the vehicle. Any key that is lost or damaged by the student will result in the student being invoiced for a new lock set for the vehicle.
3. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will endeavour to match students with suitable vehicles for all motorcycle courses but in the event that Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) is unable to do so, for reasons beyond their control, a substitute vehicle will be made, if available. If not available then a refund for that days training or test fees will be offered
4. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicles are all thoroughly maintained and serviced, however, in the event of a mechanical breakdown Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will endeavour to provide a substitute vehicle. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) is not responsible for any mechanical breakdown of its vehicles.
5. Students are NOT permitted to sit on, touch or ride any Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicle without the direct permission of a Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) Instructor. Students are only permitted to use a Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) vehicle in the presence of an Instructor. Students sitting on, touching or riding a vehicle without the Instructor being present are using the vehicle without Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) permission. In this instance all training will be terminated immediately. No refund will be offered.

SAFETY EQUIPMENT

1. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will provide helmets, gloves and wetproofs, if needed, free of charge for those students who require them. Please note we do not supply motorcycle jackets, trousers or boots. All safety equipment is regularly checked to ensure it meets required health and safety requirements. Students that require safety equipment will look after all equipment provided and return each item used at the end of each training day.
2. In the event that any equipment is damaged, either by deliberate act or accident, the student will reimburse Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) the cost to replace the damaged item.
3. Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) has sufficient motorcycle safety helmets, gloves and wetproofs. Should a student not find a safety helmet, gloves or wetproofs at Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) to fit, then the student will have to provide his/her own safety helmet, gloves and wetproofs.

HEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) does not have any height restrictions for any of its motorcycle courses. However, if a student turns up for training and is unable to safely control any class of motorcycle then Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to determine a safer option.

EYESIGHT TEST

On the first day of training you will be expected to read a number plate from the legally required distance of 20.5m. If vision aids are required to successfully complete the eyesight test, these vision aids must be worn when riding our vehicles. Failure to clearly read the pass the eyesight test will result in the immediate termination of the student's training.

ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Arriving for training under the influence of alcohol or drugs will result in the immediate cancellation of the entire training day. No refund will be given for the days training lost.

DRIVER AND VEHICLE STANDARDS AGENCY (DVSA)

Training and testing (as arranged with and conducted by the DVSA) to be at the time, date and place specified. All arrangements with the DVSA are subject to the terms and conditions of that body over which Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) has no control.

ABUSIVE BEHAVIOUR

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will not tolerate abusive behaviour towards any member of staff, DVSA employee, or any other Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) student. Any student behaving in an abusive or disruptive manner will have their training immediately terminated. They will be asked to leave the premises immediately and any incident may be reported to the police. No refund will be given for any remaining training.

VALUABLES AND PERSONAL PROPERTY

All personal property is left on site at the students own risk.

ANCILLARY

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right and at it's discretion to refund the course fee in full instead of providing Bike training and/or testing.

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to vary or change these terms and conditions without prior notice. Each student, on booking, will be asked to read and agree to our current terms and conditions.

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to vary or change all training course prices without prior notice.

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) reserves the right to determine riding standards in all respects as criteria for submitting students for testing. Such criteria is to be in accordance with regulations and guidance as issued by the DVSA.

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) will charge 10% of any booking fee previously made on any cancellation/change to any student training course or CBT. Please note no refund will be made should a student wish to cancel or change their course/CBT or assessment date.

Moto-pass (Motorcycle Training) terms and conditions will change in response to market forces. We reserve the right to make any changes necessary to continue to operate effectively in the market place without giving prior notice. All motorcycles and mopeds are NOT covered for accidental damage; you may therefore wish to take out extra cover. This can be covered by CDW insurance, please note if you choose not to take out CDW all accidental damage to motorcycles and mopeds must be paid for in full within 14 working days.
